Research Tip of the Month: Start Small

January resolutions can sometimes feel overwhelming. When it comes to genealogy, consider starting small. Choose one individual, one record group, or one research question. Document what you already know, note what you want to learn, and identify just one next step. Small, steady progress often leads to the most meaningful breakthroughs.

January is a New Beginning

We have been conditioned to think “New Year, New Start.” Whether you define resolutions or set goals, the beginning of a new year seems like a great place to start (or stop). In reality, everyday can be a great place to start.

We encourage you to look at your previous work with a fresh set of eyes. Keep in mind that no family tree is ever truly complete. The generations keep piling up and cousins keep dropping in. Don’t set out to do it all.

Instead, define your project or outcome more specifically. You could focus on the life of a single ancestor. You could commit to locating birth and death records for a single generation. There are so many options. For example, we have a member committed to finding and visiting the final resting place of each of their great grandparents.

New Year's Day (January 1) - A time traditionally associated with fresh starts, goal setting, and reflection—much like beginning a new research project or revisiting an old one with new eyes.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day (January 19, 2026) - A day to honor service, leadership, and legacy, reminding us that individual lives—documented and remembered—can shape history in profound ways.

AI Query of the Month: Where Do I Start?

This is a good time to define your next project or to figure out where to go next with a stalled one. You can use AI to help you get started.

AI Query:

“What questions should I ask before starting (or restarting) a genealogy research project on one ancestor?”

Use AI as a brainstorming partner to help identify gaps, generate research questions, or suggest ways to organize what you already know before diving back into records. This is a great way to get those fresh eyes on your project.

CGS DNA Series

Are you interested in hearing more about the use of DNA to identify family members? Whether you have done a DNA test or are just interested in hearing the details of an actual hunt, you should consider attending the January event.

Libby Dollar will continue the CGS DNA series with her talk on Finding Birth Parents Using DNA.
